Abstract: A polycentric world order and a new system of principles and institutions of its political and economic organization and governance are being formed. At the heart of these processes is the strengthening of new regional and global centers of the world economy and politics and the development of a complex multi-vector system of cooperation and competition between them, as well as between them and the former leaders of the international system. Significant intensification of competition between states and between states and between leading transnational companies is taking place. At the same time global interdependence also continues to grow. The US and their allies in Europe and Asia are trying to concentrate resources to maintain the global leadership. China is actively converting its economic potential and technological development into military capabilities and political power. Russia is engaged into the deep conflict with the US and NATO for its right to protect its interests and security space in the close neighborhood. India's geography, history, demography and economy have contributed to distinct Indian perspectives in its relationship with all major powers, as well as its own concept of a multipolar world, which includes a multipolar Asia. What these trends mean for development of Russia and India? How they will impact on India – Russia relations in near future and long-term perspectives?

**Abstract:** Russia, like India, and most of the other Eurasian and African civilizations, was originally a river civilization. Rivers served as trade routes and roads; various cultures spread and interacted along them. It was through the river systems that the exchange of goods between the north and south of Eurasia was carried out, both Russia and India were involved in this exchange since the Early Medieval times. Rivers have always been the connecting threads for the Eurasian peoples, tying together the continent politically, economically, culturally and sacredly. At the same time, the seas into which these rivers flowed also formed an integral part of this system, washing the shores of Eurasia and Africa. We can and should see them as an inseparable and integrated river and sea system.

SLOCs and river routes, ports, establishing interaction both along sea routes (Mumbai-Novorossiysk, Chennai-Vladivostok) and along river ones (South-North corridor). Blue economy, cleaning, maintaining and developing river routes, integrating them with sea and land routes. Logistics of infrastructure and connectivity is today inextricable from geopolitical competition – in the Indo-Pacific and in the western Indian Ocean. India and Russia have both common interests and

**Abstract:** The main goal for Russia and India now is to ensure internal and external stability, which would allow them to develop their economies and to guarantee the absence of social upheavals both within their borders and in the areas of immediate neighborhood. The situation for both countries is paradoxically similar: both have weaker but dangerous opponents at their side, who are supported by powerful rivals interested in weakening Russia and India, and both are trying to maintain peace and tranquility in their sphere of influence.

The global transformation of the world order also poses a challenge for Moscow and New Delhi: how to avoid the shocks associated with the end of the period of American-led globalization, to guarantee stable economic growth and the absence of internal problems? How to ensure the development of high-tech, which can provide our countries with the technological sovereignty, and at the same time turn it into a driver of social development for all parts of the society in order to avoid further widening the gap between rich and poor?



**Abstract:** One of the prerequisites for this stability is the preservation of peace in Eurasia and Africa, ensuring security and uninterrupted connectivity there, including not only land, but also sea, river and air, Space and cyber. What Russia and India can do together to develop connectivity through Eurasian landmass and safety and freedom of navigation for surrounding sea routes around? What main challenges for Eurasian connectivity and maritime safety can be defined and how they can be responded? What can Russia and India do to prevent Eurasia and Africa from slipping into regional and broader conflicts and military confrontation? What trends in global military development and buildup will have the most significant effects on the development and security of India and Russia and their relations with other major powers.

Russia is currently engaged in seeking to order the European security architecture in its own security interests. For India, the Indo-Pacific security architecture and Eurasian security (Central Asia, Caspian, West Asia and Caucasus) are of immediate concern. Though current geopolitical concerns may create some short-term issues, there is convergence in our long-term perspectives.







A Gold Medalist in Economics from Bombay University, Prof. Madhav Das Nalapat specializes in religious extremism, national security, foreign policy, and political strategy. Renowned for advocating "India First" and positioning India as a Global Power, he has introduced original concepts like "Authoritarian expansionism and Wahhabism" as the main security threat of the future. His contributions span global television channels as a geopolitical analyst, along with publications like China Daily, Global Times, CNN Global Square, The Diplomat, The Pakistan Observer, Gateway House, Radio Free Europe, United Press International, Huffington Post, and The Times, establishing their authority in shaping discourse on critical issues. His latest book "Cold War 2.0: Ilusion versus Reality" was published worldwide by Penguin Random House in September 2023.





An esteemed Distinguished Fellow at USI & CAPS and Strategic Advisor for the Synergia Foundation, Air Marshal Khosla consistently excels, evidenced by his first-place standings in various courses, showcasing his commitment to excellence within the Indian Air Force.







Ambassador Ashok Sajjanhar's distinguished diplomatic career spans numerous pivotal assignments across the globe. Having served in diplomatic capacities in Moscow, Tehran, Geneva, Dhaka, Bangkok, Washington, Brussels, Astana, Stockholm, and Riga, he has left an indelible mark on Indian foreign relations. Notably, during his tenure in Geneva (1988-1992), he played a crucial role in representing India in the Uruguay Round of Multilateral Trade negotiations. Additionally, his tenure as Director of the Jawaharlal Nehru Cultural Centre in Moscow saw a significant transformation in cultural diplomacy, showcasing his multidimensional diplomatic acumen.






